Today's gospel gives us the story of the raising of the son of the widow of Nain. A look at the literary context of the 7th chapter of the Gospel of Luke will help us to understand this episode. The evangelist wishes to show that Jesus opens the way for us by showing us something of what is new about God as it comes to us in the proclamation of the Good News. This is how transformation and openness come about: Jesus listens to the prayer of a foreigner, a non-Jew (Lk 7:1-10) and raises the son of a widow (Lk 7:11-17) The way in which Jesus reveals the Reign of God comes as a surprise to the Jewish brethren who were not used to this kind of openness. It is a surprise also to John the Baptist who sends messengers to ask, Are you the one who is to come or are we to wait for another (Lk 7:18-30). Jesus mocks the fickleness of his contemporaries: They are like children sitting in the market-place and calling to one another, "We played the flute for you, and you did not dance; we wailed, and you did not weep". (Lk 7:31-35). At the end we see *Jesus' openness to women (Lk 7:36-50)*

Following on from last weeks information of Holy Communion, which seems to have been well received, we continue in the same theme with some more useful information: The following are important points to keep in mind when receiving Holy Communion.

If one intends to receive Communion in the hand, one should make sure one's hands are washed before Mass. Parents should insure that their children's hands are washed. If at Communion time one's hands are dirty or marred (for instance, with dried paint or ink stains), one should receive Communion on the tongue.

In receiving Communion, "bodily demeanour (gestures, clothing) ought to convey the respect, solemnity, and joy of this moment when Christ becomes our guest" (*CCC* 1387). Please dress appropriately for Mass, and please process reverently to and from Communion.

When you face the priest, indicate *clearly* how you wish to receive the host—whether on the tongue or in the hand.

To receive a blessing instead of Communion, cross your arms over your chest and bow your head.

To receive the host on the tongue, keep your hands folded, respond "Amen!" to "The Body of Christ," and then open your mouth and stick out your tongue *all the way*, so that the priest can easily place the host on your tongue.

To receive Communion in the hand, open your hands until they are *nearly flat* with one hand underneath the other and raise your hands until they are at *chest level*. Respond "Amen!" to the "Body of Christ." The priest will then place the host on the palm of your hand (do not take it). Step to the side and place the host in your mouth *in view of the priest*.

To receive the Precious Blood from the chalice, respond "Amen!" to the "Blood of Christ," and then accept the cup with *both hands*. Take a sip of the Precious Blood, and then return the cup, being sure the minister has a good grip on the cup before you let go.

Thank you in advance for your thoughtful preparation to receive Communion and for your careful execution of the Communion rite. Watch to see how beautiful our Communion rite becomes!
