Parish Priest: Fr Kevin A. Dow

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Jesus' preaching draws many people (Mk 3:7-8). A small community begins to form around him. At first, two persons (Mk 1:16-18); then another two (Mk 1:19-20); then twelve (Mk 3:13-19); and now in our text, more than seventy-two persons (Lk 10:1). The community continues to grow. One thing Jesus insists on is community life. He set the example. He never wished to work alone. The first thing he did at the beginning of his preaching in Galilee was to call people to live with him and share in his mission (Mk 1:16-20; 3,14). The ambience of fraternity that grows around Jesus is a foretaste of the Kingdom, a proof of the new experience of God with the Father. Thus, if God is Father and Mother, then we are all one family of brothers and sisters. Thus is the community born, the new family (cf. Mk 3:34-35).

This Sunday's Gospel tells us of practical things to direct the seventy-two disciples in their proclamation of the Good News of the Kingdom and in rebuilding community life. Proclaiming the Good News of the Kingdom and rebuilding community life are two sides of the same coin. One does not exist and cannot make sense without the other.

In light of today's Gospel, reflect upon what you can do to help build up our parish community. What ministry can you volunteer to do? What talent do you have that should be shared with others?

The Basics of the Faith: Should Catholics know their Catechism?

Yes, of course!

The main sources for all catechesis are the Holy Scriptures and the Catechism of the Catholic Church. So where does the Catechism come into all of this? Well, the Catechism presents what Catholic Christians essentially and fundamentally believe. The main sources of the Catholic Catechism are the Sacred Scriptures, the Fathers of the Church, the Liturgy, and the Church's Magisterium. So, basically, it is the what and why's of what we believe as Christians.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church is organised into four main areas or sections called pillars.

1. The Creed (a.k.a. The Baptismal Profession of Faith) *Those who belong to Christ through* faith and Baptism must confess their baptismal faith before men (Mt 10:32; Rom 10:9). First therefore the Catechism expounds revelation, by which God addresses and gives himself to man, and the faith by which man responds to God (Section One). The profession of faith summarises the gifts that God gives man: as the Author of all that is good; as Redeemer; and as Sanctifier. It develops these in the three chapters on our baptismal faith in the one God: the almighty Father, the Creator; his Son Jesus Christ, our Lord and Saviour; and the Holy Spirit, the Sanctifier, in the Holy Church (Section Two).

2. The Sacraments of Faith This explains how God's salvation, accomplished once for all through Christ Jesus and the Holy Spirit, is made present in the sacred actions of the Church's liturgy (Section One), especially in the seven sacraments (Section Two).

3. The Life of Faith deals with the final end of man created in the image of God: beatitude, and the ways of reaching it — through right conduct freely chosen, with the help of God's law and grace (Section One), and through conduct that fulfils the twofold commandment of charity, specified in God's Ten Commandments (Section Two).

4. The Prayer of the Believer deals with the meaning and importance of prayer in the life of believers (Section One). It concluded with a brief commentary on the seven petitions of the Lord's Prayer (Section Two), for indeed we find in these the sum of all the good things which we must hope for and which our heavenly Father wants to grant us.

Do not be intimidated by the Catechism. It is actually more easy to read than you might think. Likewise, do not be afraid to read your Bible. Copies of the Compendium of the CCC are on sale in the piety stall in the church porch. Priced £8 each.
