

# **NEWS & EVENTS**

**Welcome:** If you are a visitor to the parish, we want you to know how welcome you are — whether you have come from another part of the country, from across the world or simply from another parish.

**Fr Radoslaw Suchorab** We thank Fr Radek for his ministry and presence these past few weeks and we wish him well as he returns to Poland during the coming week.

Sponsored Walk: A sponsored walk has been organised for the parishioners of Ss John & Columba's (St Peter's parishioners are also welcome!) to come together and raise some money to help pay for the re-painting of the church exterior, and to have some 'fun' together as we walk the costal path that runs along the south of our parish boundary. The walk from Crombie to this side of the motorway at South Queensferry, is 9 miles long. The date is set for Saturday 19th August and I'm informed should take about 3 hours.... Sponsor sheets are available at the back of the church.

Project Truth: Members of SPUC will again be carrying out their road show, bringing the pro-life message to the streets of Scotland. Workshops on the Holy Eucharist The workshops will take place in St James' Church Kinross on Wednesday 9th and Wednesday 16th of August, from 6.00p.m. to 9.00p.m. each night. The suggested donation for each session is £5.00, though this should not hinder anyone from coming who would hope to at-

tend. Bibles are an absolute necessity for each part! Recommended versions are either RSV Catholic Edition or the New American Bible.

Eucharist Part 1: History and Historical Understanding of the Eucharist This workshop covers the Eucharist as found in the New Testament. The Eucharist is central to the Liturgy of the Church, and this workshop looks at the earliest documents about its historical origin, among the issues addressed will be: 1. Why do we have four different accounts of the Eucharist in the Gospels? 2. Why are there significant differences between the accounts of the Last Supper/Eucharist? 3. Why doesn't St. John have a Eucharistic Last Supper? 4. Was the Last Supper really a Passover meal?

Eucharist Part 2: Theology of the Eucharist and Living the Faith This workshop draws from the first part to consider the theology of the New Testament authors and texts. We will then consider the import of that theology of the Eucharist for each author, how it is reflected in what they wrote, and what it therefore means for a New Testament theology of the Eucharist. We will then consider how that understanding of the Eucharist relates to the Mass, the faith community, and the vocation of every Catholic.
