In the Gospel of this Sunday, Jesus questions concerning who people think he is: "Who do people say that I am?" After knowing the opinion of the people, he wants to know the opinion of his disciples. St Peter, in the name of all makes his profession of faith. Jesus confirms Peter's faith and gives him the keys of heaven and earth. The keys are most often represented in art as being gold and silver to represent the power of loosing and binding. The gold key alludes to the power in the kingdom of the heavens and the silver key indicates the spiritual authority of the papacy on earth. The cord with the bows that unites the grips alludes to the bond between the two powers. In the crest of our Inverkeithing parish, we have the cross keys with the chain, symbolising that not once, but twice, St Peter was bound in chains, because of his love for our Blessed Lord.

Your love, O Lord, is eternal: discard not the work of your hands.
