

In this Sunday's Gospel passage Jesus recounts a very common event in family life. One son says to the father, "I'm going!" but then does not go. Another son says, "I'm not going!" but then goes. Jesus asks his listeners to pay attention and express an opinion.

Anyone who wished to apply this parable today, would probably provoke the same anger that Jesus did through his conclusion. The same thing happens today. Prostitutes, sinners, the ignorant, some women, children, lay people, workers, black persons, prisoners, homosexuals, persons with AIDS, drunkards, drug addicts, divorced persons, married clergy, heretics, atheists, unmarried mothers, the unemployed, the illiterate, the sick, that is, all those marginalised as not part of the religious circle, these persons, frequently, have a sharper outlook in perceiving the way of justice rather than those of us who live all day in church and are part of the religious hierarchy. It is not because a person belongs to the religious hierarchy, therefore, that he or she has a pure outlook that allows him or her to perceive the things of God in life.
