
#### Prayer to Saint Michael

The sadness of the man when he realized he could not do what Jesus asked indicates that all is not over - that sadness will lead him to reflect on what was asked of him and to gradually move towards a response. There are moments in the spiritual life when the step forward is relatively easy. There are other points where the step seems enormous because it involves something of great significance to us. If we are sad because we cannot take the step at this point in time, we can be assured that he will ask again, perhaps proposing a smaller step that will ultimately lead to the bigger step. As the man turned away sad the question in his mind may have been "Who am I without my wealth?" It is our question too, crucial in the process of letting go: "Who am I without this?"
