Our Liturgy follows on from last week's—the theme is our attitude to and depth of prayer. In our first reading Sirach writes that God's mercy will favour the unfortunate and the wronged. Our prayers will be heard if we become their servants. The Psalm reiterates that the poor and humble are favoured in God's hearing. Jesus is building on these teachings, challenging us. In his parable of the Pharisee and the Publican, the Pharisee keeps the law. He expects his prayer to rise to heaven. But Jesus tells us prayer is more than doing good works—it is about our attitude of heart. Whilst the Pharisee is smug and judgmental, the Publican in his contrition is being heard and he is the one who goes home 'at rights with God.' In prayer I search my heart. Aware of any judgment separating me from others, I ask God to free me.
