
Prayer to Saint Michael

The Sadducees came to Jesus with their tricky question in an attempt to put him down in front of others. They hoped to humiliate him, or lead him to say something which contravened the law. They may even have been hoping to trap Jesus into rejecting the concept of the resurrection of the dead, as they themselves did.

Instead the Sadducees did what people who attempt to humiliate or put others down often do — they revealed themselves to be small-minded with a rather nasty streak of jealousy and vindictiveness. Jesus was become an important person in their world and their attempt to cut him down to size gave him the opportunity to speak about a vision of resurrection and life after death which was completely different to the caricature of the after-life presented by the Sadducees.

In his reply Jesus spoke about the "other world" in which the love of God reflected in marriage is known in its fullness; where life is not shadowed by death, and where, like the angels, we will live in the presence of God. He spoke about those in the "other world" as "children of the resurrection", contradicting the Sadducees' belief that there is no resurrection.
