

This weekend the Church celebrates the 100-year anniversary of the Marian apparitions at Fatima, Portugal, witnessed by three shepherd children who reported that they saw visions of Mary beginning on May 13, 1917.

The apparitions of Mary at Fatima, witnessed by three shepherd children, began on May 13, 1917 and then again on the 13th day of five subsequent months. They were declared "worthy of belief" in 1930.

The saintly Pope John Paul II credited his survival of an assassination attempt to Mary — on the very day 64 years after the first apparition of our Lady in Fatima. He said it was a "mother's hand that guided the bullet's path."

May our Blessed Mother intercede for us, and lead us to true conversion from sin.
