

Today is the 6th Sunday of Easter. Our journey of discovery of the risen Christ with the disciples is drawing to its dramatic conclusion. This coming Thursday we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord and then on 4th June we celebrate the great Solemnity of Pentecost. In these closing days of the Easter Season our readings, especially the Gospel, change from direct encounters with the Risen Christ to Jesus' Last Supper Discourses from St John's Gospel where Jesus assured the disciples that no matter what happened, they would not be left to fend for themselves.

The Easter Season is about *mystagogy*, to lead through the mysteries. Mystagogy is part of the Christian Initiation process when newly baptized Catholics are introduced to and participate in the sacramental life of the Church. But mystagogy is so much more than an introduction to the sacramental mysteries of the Church. It is a lifelong process. It is our perpetual discovery of God's abiding love for us.
