

Palm Sunday is the final Sunday of Lent, the beginning of Holy Week and commemorates the triumphant arrival of Christ in Jerusalem, days before he was crucified. Palm Sunday is known as such because, as Jesus rode in on a donkey to the lavish praise of the townspeople, they threw palms or small branches, in front of him as a sign of homage. This was a customary practice for people to show great respect. Palm branches are widely recognised as a symbol of peace and victory. Jesus' use of a donkey instead of a horse is highly symbolic as it represents the arrival of someone in peace, as opposed to arriving on a steed for war. Holy Week, particularly the Triduum, is the most sacred time in the Church's calendar. Masses and Liturgies are outlined in the timetable . Please try to attend some or all of the Triduum and support each other at this very special time. Palm Sunday Masses will commence with the blessing of the palms **outside** (weather permitting) and the entrance into Church.
