St John goes through the region of the Jordan preaching a baptism of penance so as to obtain pardon for one's sins. Repentance (in Greek: metanoia) means change, not just in one's moral behaviour, but also and above all in one's mentality. Change in one's way of thinking! People were to become aware that their way of thinking, influenced by the "yeast of the Pharisees and the yeast of Herod" (Mk 8:15), that is by the government's propaganda and by the official religion, was wrong and had to change. Pardon brings with it reconciliation with God and with the neighbour. In this way, John was

proclaiming a new way for the people to relate to God. Reconciliation will also be the mark of Jesus' preaching: reconciliation even "seventy times seven" (Mt 18:22).

This coming Tuesday, 8th December, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, is the start of the Year of Mercy, as called for by Pope Francis. Will you seek the mercy and forgiveness that Christ is calling you to? that he longs to share with you, if only you would seek it.

Please make use of the sacrament of reconciliation (confession), and so receive the Lord's mercy in your life.

Year of Mercy: As you know, some months ago, our Holy Father Pope Francis, with his special letter 'Misericordiae Vultus', the 'Face of Mercy' promulgated an Extraordinary Holy Year of Mercy. This Holy Year will begin on 8th December, 2015 and end on the Feast of Christ the King, 20th November, 2016.

A Jubilee, of course, accords us a very special time of reflection in the life of the Church. This particular Jubilee focuses on the Theme of Mercy which lies both at the heart of the teaching of the Old Testament and is central to the ministry of Jesus, as described in the Gospels of the New Testament. The teaching of St Paul in his letters also, and the teaching of St John the Evangelist in his letters speak constantly of mercy. Divine Mercy is the Father's bountiful and faithful love for us as communicated to us in the love of Our Lord, Jesus Christ.

During this Holy Year there will be many opportunities to express our faith as a Catholic people. There will be many opportunities to celebrate the Holy Year with various activities in the parish, deanery and archdiocese, echoing the Church's celebrations happening centrally in the Holy City of Rome, presided over by the Holy Father. In October or November, there will be a Diocesan Pilgrimage to Rome where we can celebrate the Mercy of the Lord, visit the threshold of the Tombs of the Apostles Peter and Paul, and visit the Holy Father, under the leadership of the Archbishop.

There will also be a number of designated Churches in the Archdiocese which will remind us of our links with our Cathedral Church and with the Holy Father in Rome. In these sanctuaries of mercy we will be encouraged to pray the prayers of the Holy Year to gain the Plenary Indulgence promulgated by Pope Francis. Some of the local sanctuaries are St Margaret's, Dunfermline and St James', St Andrews.
