

# NEWS & EVENTS

**Welcome:** If you are a visitor to the parish, we want you to know how welcome you are — whether you have come from another part of the country, from across the world or simply from another parish.

**The Introit for Gaudete Sunday** is taken from Philippians 4:4,5: "Gaudete in Domino semper" ("Rejoice in the Lord always").

Like Lent, Advent is a penitential season, so the priest normally wears purple vestments. But today, on Gaudete Sunday, having passed the midpoint of Advent, the Church lightens the mood a little, and the clergy wear rose vestments. The change in colour provides us with encouragement to continue our spiritual preparation—especially prayer and fasting—for Christmas.

For this same reason, the third candle of the Advent wreath, lit on Gaudete Sunday, is traditionally rose coloured.

Bambinelli Sunday, Blessing the Christ Child: Another Advent devotion, is the blessing of the images of the baby Jesus from the family crib sets. During Fr Kevin's first Advent in the parish around 50 figures were handed out to the children of the parish, and over the years other children have brought their own figures along to be blessed. The blessing of the baby Jesus will take place at Masses this weekend, so please look out your 'baby Jesus' and bring it along to be blessed!

Clearing up any confusion: As Catholics we are obliged to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. Therefore next weekend, we are obliged to attend a Mass for the Sunday (choice of 3 in our parishes) AND a Mass for Christmas (choice of 3 in our parishes). Therefore over next weekend, you will be attending either once on Saturday and again on Sunday evening/Monday or attending Sunday morning and again on Sunday evening/Monday.

Stewardship Reflection: "Rejoice always, pray constantly, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you" - 1 THESSALONIANS 5:16-18

This scripture reading sums up Stewardship. "Rejoice always" means place your trust in God; He will provide all that you need. "Pray constantly" means prayer should be a running conversation with God throughout the whole day, every day. "Give thanks in all circumstances" means even in bad situations, thank God. Suffering a little bit helps build empathy for others in similar situations.
