
Prayer to Saint Michael



On this third Sunday of Lent, our Gospel passage follows immediately on the first sign that Jesus gave in Cana of Galilee (2:1-12). Some expressions and phrases are repeated in both scenes and lead us to think that the author wanted to contrast the two scenes. In Cana, a village in Galilee, during a wedding feast, a Jewish woman, the mother of Jesus, expresses her unconditional faith in Jesus and invites others to accept his word (2:3-5). On the other hand, "the Jews", during the Paschal celebration in Jerusalem, refuse to believe in Jesus and do not accept his word. In Cana, Jesus worked his first sign (2:11) and here the Jews ask for a sign (v.18) but then do not accept the sign Jesus gives them (2:20).

God gives us many signs of his presence in our life. Are we capable of seeing and accepting them?

Response to the Psalm: You have the message of eternal life, O Lord.

<u>Gospel Acclamation:</u> **Praise to you, O Christ, king of eternal glory!** *I am the resurrection and the life, says the Lord; whoever believes in me will never die.*
