On this day we celebrate the arrival of Jesus into Jerusalem for the festival of Passover. Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey, and large crowds of very excited people spread branches on the road — and even laid down their clothes! They shouted 'Hosanna!' which means 'Save us Now!' We are given crosses made from single palm leaves and sing songs of praise. This is to help us imagine what Jesus' entry into Jerusalem might have been like. Jesus performed many miracles and the news about how He healed many people, and of His teachings spread very quickly. Jesus came to earth to free us from our sins (things we do wrong), and Jesus offers us the gift of everlasting life. How quickly the crowds change from singing 'Hosanna' to shouting 'crucify him.' Perhaps we should examine our own lives and see where we have been too quick to judge others and turn against them.
