The scribes in today's Gospel accuse Jesus of wielding diabolical power: "by the ruler of the demons He casts out demons." They had made their judgment and would allow nothing — no good works, no life-giving message, no joy to penetrate their consciousness and modify their opinion. Jesus calls that attitude blasphemy against the Holy Spirit. It is a form of idolatry through which we divinize our own opinion or dogma, refusing to allow God or anyone to

break through to broaden our vision. This sin is unforgiveable ("an everlasting sin") because people who willingly imprison themselves in an ideology wall themselves off from grace and initiate their own rigor mortis. Jesus' condemnation of that attitude was the harshest critique He spoke in the Gospels. He directed it at people who had so entrapped themselves that they would only go from bad to worse, eventually plotting His crucifixion.
