

Jesus did not feed the 5,000 in today's gospel with nothing. He started with something that was already there. A small child was willing to share what he had with others, including the strangers around him. The Eucharist we are celebrating today is about that giving, about loving and about sharing. Bread which has been offered-by all of us—is blessed at the consecration, then broken and divided and given out to all. The Eucharist transforms when we consciously celebrate it in this way, as a genuine sign of what we want to practice in our daily lives. It takes courage and trust to give when we are unsure of the outcome, but the our gospel tells us that there were twelve baskets left over, the number of completion, signifying the generosity with which God wants to meet our needs. As a community, this gospel meets us where we are. What are we sensing God asking of us which could bless and transform our situation and those around us? (John 6: 1-15)

**Stewardship Reflection**: "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish; but what good are these for so many?" JOHN 6:9

The miracle of the Loaves and Fishes is the only miracle which is recorded six times in the Gospel. It carries two important messages. First, no matter how little we have, we always have enough to share. Second, Christ can take our humble gifts and do great things with them if we are just willing to let Him. No gift is too small or insignificant!
