What is unique about a Catholic community, what should be unique about our community of Faith? Love, is the answer. Love is the distinguishing mark of any Catholic community, and above all it must be the distinguishing mark of Christ's Church both universal and local. We are all called to love. Sometimes love is warm, comforting, consoling, but also love can be challenging, it can make demands, it can require sacrifice – the Cross of Jesus Christ is the very proof of this. Our vocation is to live lives of love, where we are, now – to be instruments of love in the circumstances in which God has placed us. NEWS & EVENTS

Welcome: If you are a visitor to the parishes, we want you to know how welcome you are — whether you have come from another part of the country, from across the world or simply from another parish.

Teas and coffees are available this Sunday in St Peter in Chains Church Hall from 10.30 am, and in Our Lady of Lourdes Hall every Sunday after the 11.30am Mass. Proceeds going to assist sick parishioners to travel to Lourdes as pilgrims in July.

Rorate Caeli Masses: we will celebrate on the Tuesday evening in Rosyth and on the Thursday in Dunfermline Rorate Caeli Masses, which are a traditional Advent devotion wherein we celebrate the Mass of the Blessed Virgin Mary for Advent. The interplay of light and darkness speak to the meaning of Advent and the coming of the Light of the world. The Mass takes its title, Rorate Caeli, from the first words of the Introit, which are from Isaiah 45:8: "Rorate caeli, desuper et nubes pluant justum, aperiaturterra, etgerminet Salvatorem." ("Drop down dew, ye heavens, from above, and let the clouds rain the just: let the earth be opened and bud forth a Saviour.") The Rorate Mass is lit only by candlelight. Because it is a votive Mass in Mary's honour, white vestments are worn instead of the normal Advent violet. In the dimly lit setting, priest and faithful prepare to honour the Light of the world, Who is soon to be born, and offer praise to God for the gift of Our Lady. The readings and prayers of the Mass foretell the prophecy of the Virgin who would bear a Son called Emmanuel and call on all to raise the gates of their hearts and their societies to let Christ the King enter; asking for the grace to receive eternal life by the merits of the Incarnation and saving Resurrection of Our Lord. It is always good for us, as Catholics, to experience

It is always good for us, as Catholics, to experience the richness and diversity of the Church's faith and liturgical practice and to draw upon the treasures of our tradition to help us grow in our faith and understanding of who we are as God's people. For some this will be a new experience, for others it may be familiar, but I assure you that it will be something that will help us to raise our hearts and

minds even more to our dear God, looking forward in company with Our Blessed Lady to the birth of Our Saviour and her Son. Confessions will be heard before the Masses and we welcome Fr Michael Carrie on the 13th and Fr Scott Deeley on the 20th as visiting confessors and celebrants.
