As we begin hearing from St. Luke's Gospel at Sunday Mass, we recognise that a gospel is not a collection of anecdotes about Jesus and his teaching. Every evangelist is a witness to the Son of God. He responds to the question posed by those who have met Jesus in the living word of the community, 'Who are you, Lord?' Each of these witnesses reports his faith in the Lord according to the history of his own community's experiences and reflections on Jesus. This

explains why no two gospels are exactly the same.

Nevertheless, there is only one Gospel because there is only one Christ. Luke sets Jesus' first preaching in the synagogue at Nazareth. Jesus comments on a passage he has just read from Isaiah. His homily consists of a single affirmation, 'This text is being fulfilled today even as you listen.' As we listen to the rest of Luke's Gospel over the coming year, we hear how Jesus' life bears out what he has proclaimed, that Jesus' presence among the people represents 'the Lord's year of favour'.

Alleluia!
