St Cyril of Alexandria, the great Church father of the fourth century who commented extensively on St Luke's Gospel said that those who heard Jesus speak treated His words as worthless. I think the same happens today. When we hear words pleasing to us, we accept them, but when they disturb our consciences, we might well dismiss them as worthless. There are people who choose a church where they get good feelings from warm and fuzzy words. Certainly, it is true that the Gospel is a great word of consolation and refreshment, but it can also be harsh and demanding, as Jesus himself could be harsh and demanding. Our "precious" Saviour can also be an "angry" God. The people in the synagogue were so upset they wanted to drive Jesus over the edge of a cliff, but His time had not yet come. When we listen to the Gospel, it is good to do so with an open heart and mind. The Church will guide us and teach us. The Holy Spirit will instruct us in all things and help us discern how to respond to the Gospel in our lives. The one thing we do not want to do is to push Jesus to the edge of the cliff or regard His teaching as worthless. Jesus' teaching consoles us for it is a Gospel of love and mercy, peace and reconciliation. But it is also a Gospel which says "come, follow me," a Gospel which calls for a conversion of heart and change in the way we live.
