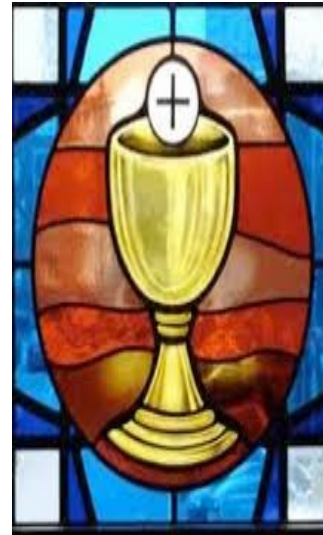

Corpus Christ: As we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, let us reflect upon our own personal relationship with this wondrous gift that has been given to us by God Himself. At the Last Supper, Christ gives the command to take and eat His Body, to drink His Blood. As Catholics, we believe this to mean that all who are part of the Communion of the Church, all who are united to the body of the Church, and living in a state of Grace are welcome to receive.

Sometimes however, we take this gift for granted. Do we take the time to spiritually prepare ourselves to receive the Lord? Do we go to confession before receiving our Lord, when we know that we are not in a state of Grace? Do we take time to pray before the Blessed Sacrament or are we perhaps careless in our actions before our Lord, present on the altar during exposition? Do we make use of the opportunities given to us in our parish of times of Exposition (Tuesdays, Thursdays and Sundays)? Perhaps we need to take time and reflect upon what Jesus Christ, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity really means to me.....?
