The Gospel passage this Sunday concerns the beginning of Jesus' discourse on the end of the world. The passage Luke 21:5-36 is a whole literary unit. Jesus is in Jerusalem, at the entrance to the temple, the Passion is near. The Synoptic

Gospels (also see Mt 24; Mk 13) have the so called "eschatological" discourse precede the account of the Passion, Death and Resurrection. These are events to be read in the light of the Passover. The language is the "apocalyptic" one. Attention is not placed on each word, but on the announcement of the total overturn. The community of Luke already knew about the events concerning the destruction of Jerusalem. The Evangelist universalizes the message and makes evident the intermediate time of the Church waiting for the coming of the Lord in glory. Luke refers to the end of time also in other parts (12:35-48;17: 20;18:18).

The Lord comes to rule the peoples with fairness.

#### **Gospel Acclamation:**

Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia! Stand erect, hold your head's high, because your liberation is near at hand.
