THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT (B)

WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN A CHRISTIAN AND SOMEONE WHO IS NOT A CHRISTIAN BUT IS SIMPLY A VERY GOOD PERSON?

Well, it could be said that a very good person uses his or her own agenda. A Christian testifies to Christ. St John the Baptist understood this very well. St John the Baptist understood that he had come as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He hadn't come to change the world or work miracles or offer salvation ... he had simply come to prepare the way for a man who could. The gospels and the course of history are filled with men and women who have borne witness to Christ, some very famous and some we will never hear of. St John the Baptist was probably the most significant because he sets the precedent. So how is St John the Baptist's example relevant to the rest of us?

In a legal context a good witness is someone who doesn't try to put their own interpretation on events. A good witness is someone who recognises the importance of truth and doesn't taint it with their own agenda. St John the Baptist takes 'witness' to another level. We are not just to report the truth, but to channel it with understanding, humility and an appreciation of our human limitations. We provide good witness when we have done something good or clever, but are careful to give God credit for it. We provide good witness when we follow Jesus' teaching but trust in God to magnify our human effort.

Advent is a time for us to wake up and see the light. Advent is a time for us to re-assess the job we feel God has set for us and to get on with it. Advent is a time we clear the obstacles and prepare straight pathways. Advent is the time we recognise that God is at the wheel.

'There stands among you the one coming after me'



Public Worship

As from the 15th July we have been able to open our 3 churches, following both the bishop's and the government guidelines.

We will only be able to continue to open our churches if enough parishioners volunteer to assist with the cleaning after each Mass...

- You may attend any weekday Mass, instead of attending the Sunday one;
 - If you are shielding, it's important that you do not come out to Mass at all;
- We will need to record your name and address when you attend Mass, in case you need to be traced;
- We are not allowed more than 50 people in church.
- Seating according to physical distancing rules. Currently, Rosyth would have a capacity of 30, Inverkeithing will also be about 30 and Dunfermline is 48. Households may sit together. You will be guided to a seat by a passkeeperyou will not be able to sit where you normally do.
- You are legally obliged to wear a face covering.

 Exemptions are children under 5 and those with a condition such as asthma.
- You will need to sanitise your hands on entering and leaving. This will be provided. Please

avoid touching statues and other surfaces. If you wish to light votive candles, please place them in the basket provided for this purpose (We ask you not to light the candles yourself, as your hands have flammable liquid on them...)

- There will be no music or singing, no readers, ministers of communion, altar servers or sacristans. Only the priest will be allowed in the sacristy and toilet facilities will not be available.
- Mass will be celebrated without the Gloria or Creed.
 - Holy Communion (under the one species) will be distributed after the final blessing and people are asked to leave immediately.
 - For holy Communion, please keep your face covering in place when you receive Holy Communion, and then step to the side, remove mask, consume and replace mask.
 - Offertory donations may be placed in baskets as you leave the church at the end of Mass
- There will be no Teas etc. after Mass.
 - We will suspend the Holy Hours to focus on Mass, until we can resume normal services.
 - The church will have to be cleaned after each Mass.
- We will need a team of at least 2
 pass keepers, and 2 or 3
 cleaners for each Mass. Please
 consider volunteering your time
 and help make this all possible.
 - My thanks to those who are presently volunteering to clean the churches at the end of each period.

DEACON PAT'S PONDERINGS



This Sunday Father Kevin and I will be looking wonderful in Pink! (Not really my colour but I think Father has the figure for it *Editors note—real men wear pink!*).

Actually, the colour of the vestments is rose and the rose-coloured candle will be lit signifying the 3rd Sunday

of Advent which is known as 'Gaudete Sunday' Its name is taken from the entrance antiphon of the Mass, which is:' *Rejoice in the Lord always*; again, I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near'.

All that been said, you should have seen the Deacon's face when he realised that this week's Sunday Gospel was the same as last week's but written by the Evangelist John and another wonderfully informative interpretation of this event would have to be found.

Now scripture is my 'thing'; I like to delve into the events of the times and discover that our traditions go all the way back to the 'Tribes of Judah' and therefore the things we do were done by Jesus, the Christ, himself.

So, John was 'baptising' or bathing people in the Jordan river as a means of purifying them and hastening the coming of the Messiah. This wasn't a new phenomenon as many Jewish groups or sects followed this formal cleansing procedure. This of course irked the members of the Sanhedrin, the politicians and High Priests and they wondered who was this person who took it upon himself, without their permission, to preach the coming of the Lord. With their curiosity aroused they promptly sent their agents to question John: "Who are you and what are you doing?" The Baptist told them quite simply "I am not the Messiah" but the interrogation continued "Are you Elijah?", "Are you the Prophet?" John answered "No" Again they asked "Who are you?"

In the words of the prophet Isaiah John told them: "I am the voice of one crying in the wilderness: Make straight the way of the Lord!" But he continued "I baptise you with water, but among you stands one whom you do not know... although he comes after me, I am not worthy to untie the strap of his sandal".

John the Baptist kindles in us the expectation of a saviour. In hindsight it is easy for us to say that Jesus was the Christ, the Messiah, but for the people of the time, those who were actually hearing John it must have been so difficult to imagine what this saviour might be.

We see John preaching without permission from the religious authorities, not only that he accepts all comers, the beggars, the prostitutes and the tax collectors for these ordinary folk came seeking forgiveness and they came from far and wide.

John does ask for a commitment from these people however, a coming together with each other in solidarity, as they try to straighten out their lives. We are seeing today in the Gospel how the people were accepting a baptism as a way of making public their decision and promise to change. Like New Year resolutions these promises are fragile and can be easily broken and lost and the root of a fault stays with us. John is leading us to Christ!

Continue reading this chapter: Christ doesn't need conversion, nor does he need John's baptism. Being the Messiah, the Saviour he has come to us to join sinners who are searching for the way to forgiveness. By accepting baptism from John Jesus is making the point you are to seek justice for everyone and reform your own life.

At the moment of rising from the water a voice from heaven was heard: "You are my Son in whom I am well pleased." And in that instant God asked Jesus to start his ministry of salvation.

In your Baptism you received the Holy Spirit and were made Priest, Prophet, and King, gifts lying dormant within you until your coming of age becoming a full member of the Church on Confirmation and the gift of Holy Communion.

Today John calls you to begin your ministry... the conversion of your life and stability in Christ.
