Sunday 18th April 2021 3rd Sunday of Easter (Year B)

"Peace be with you" - so important are these words of Jesus that we hear them three times in the Gospel. Last week we heard St John's account of one of Jesus' appearances to the disciples in the days after his death and resurrection. "Peace be with you," Jesus said as he breathed the strength of the Holy Spirit on his fearful and doubting followers. In doing this, Jesus echoed what he had said to the disciples at the Last Supper after he had washed their feet: "The Holy Spirit will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid" (Jn.14:26-7). But Thomas still doubted and needed to place his hands on the wounded body of Jesus before he could believe.

St Luke's account of the appearance of Jesus starts on the third day after the crucifixion, the day when his tomb was found empty.

On the road to Emmaus a stranger walks with two of the disciples and finally they recognise Jesus "in the breaking of the bread" (Lk.24:35).

This week's Gospel tells what followed. Jesus appears amongst all the disciples, again greeting them with: "Peace be with you." He reassures them he is not a ghost, is still with them in the flesh. And as they stand dumfounded, Jesus asks the very human question: "Have you anything here to eat?" Once again he shares a meal with his followers. And as they share the food, he opens their hearts and minds to understand what they have seen and heard.

As we share the food of our Eucharistic meal each time we gather at mass, we recall that whenever Jesus shared a meal with his followers he opened their hearts and minds. Jesus said: "Touch me and see for yourselves." We may not be there in Jerusalem in that room with the disciples reaching out to touch Jesus, but we can touch and see Jesus in all the good things around us in our world: in the food that nourishes us, the water that revives us and washes us clean, in the love of God, family and friends that sustains us.

All these are part of the Peace that we have been given and in these words we feel our call to be Peace in our families, communities, workplaces and world.



First Reading
Acts 3:13-15:17-19

Peter said to the people: 'You are Israelites, and it is the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, the God of our ancestors, who has glorified his servant Jesus, the same Jesus you handed over and then disowned in the presence of Pilate after Pilate had decided to release him. It was you who accused the Holy One, the Just One, you who demanded the reprieve of a murderer while you killed the prince of life. God, however, raised him from the dead, and to that fact we are the witnesses.

'Now I know, brothers, that neither you nor your leaders had any idea what you were really doing; this was the way God carried out what he had foretold, when he said through all his prophets that his Christ would suffer. Now you must repent and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out.'

We can be sure that we know God only by keeping his commandments. Anyone who says, 'I know him', and does not keep his commandments, is a liar, refusing to admit the truth. But when anyone does obey what he has said, God's love comes to perfection in him.

Alleluia, alleluia! Lord Jesus, explain the scriptures to us. Make our hearts burn within us as you talk to us. Alleluia!

<u>Gospel</u>

<u>LUKE 24:35-48</u>

The disciples told their story of what had happened on the road and how they had recognised Jesus at the breaking of bread.

They were still talking about all this when Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you!' In a state of alarm and fright, they thought they were seeing a ghost. But he said, 'Why are you so agitated, and why are these doubts rising in your hearts? Look at my hands and feet; yes, it is I indeed. Touch me and see for yourselves; a ghost has no flesh and bones as you can see I have.' And as he said this he showed them his hands and feet. Their joy was so great that they still could not believe it, and they stood there dumbfounded; so he said to them, 'Have you anything here to eat?' And they offered him a piece of grilled fish, which he took and ate before their eyes.

Then he told them, 'This is what I meant when I said, while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses, in the Prophets and in the Psalms has to be fulfilled.' He then opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, 'So you see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to this.'

Archdiocese Announcement Weekend Mass Bookings:

You will have seen in the news that the Scottish Government is lifting the cap on numbers attending Church services, however we are still constrained by social distancing and the space that our Churches can safely accommodate. Under direction from the Archbishop from Monday 26th April capacity within each Churches will be determined by the size of the building. Please continue to follow the guidance from the Parish Pastoral Council and book through our Church Coordinators, as well as this the use of face masks (unless exempt), hand sanitiser and one way systems will remain in place. Weddings and funeral numbers will both be increased to a maximum of 50 attendees. Currently children are not included in numbers however the Scottish government have changed its position on this. From the above date children between the age of 5 and 12 are required to be counted in numbers, so please keep this in mind when booking places at Mass.
